3 RAPID EVALUATION QUESTIONS: UNLOCKING THE POWER OF CONCISE ASSESSMENT

BALANCED: CONSIDER BOTH POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE ASPECTS; DON'T ONLY FOCUS ON SUCCESSES.

MEASURABLE: IDEALLY, THE RESPONSES SHOULD ALLOW FOR SOME QUANTIFIABLE ANALYSIS, EVEN IF IT'S SIMPLY A FREQUENCY COUNT OF RESPONSES.

FOR EXAMPLE, INSTEAD OF ASKING "HOW WAS THE WORKSHOP?", CONSIDER MORE SPECIFIC QUESTIONS SUCH AS:

1. "DID YOU FIND THE WORKSHOP CONTENT RELEVANT TO YOUR NEEDS?" (YES/NO/PARTIALLY)
2. "ON A SCALE OF 1 TO 5, HOW ENGAGING WAS THE WORKSHOP'S DELIVERY?" (1-5 RATING SCALE)

3. "WHAT IS ONE THING THAT COULD BE IMPROVED IN FUTURE WORKSHOPS?" (OPEN-ENDED TEXT BOX)

1. CHALLENGES AND LIMITATIONS OF "3 RAPID EVALUATION QUESTIONS"

WHILE EFFICIENT, "3 RAPID EVALUATION QUESTIONS" HAVE INHERENT LIMITATIONS:

USE MULTIPLE METHODS OF DISSEMINATION: USE EMAIL, SURVEYS, QR CODES, OR IN-PERSON QUESTIONNAIRES TO ENHANCE REACH.
