It also revisits creator Eric Kripke's road to creating the series, draws surprising and revealing connections between the show and other series, and discusses the ways *Supernatural* responded to social and industry changes throughout its long run. *Supernatural* was the little show that could for 15 years, persisting beyond its original network's lifespan and surviving the departure of its creator and showrunner, in no small part due to its loyal fans. Inspired by shows such as *Buffy the Vampire Slayer* and going on to influence many shows that followed, *Supernatural* offers insight into how a series can adapt and grow to become a mainstay of primetime television.
