Based upon the design of six single-span bridges with varying spans and numbers of girders, and a partial design of a three-span continuous bridge, it was concluded that the LRFD designs tend to be lighter and more economical in general and also tend to be more flexible than ASD designs of the same bridge. The weight savings appears to be more pronounced on single-span bridges than on multiple-span bridges because of the greater significance of local and lateral stability concerns in the finished bridges for multi-span bridges.
