3RD GRADE WRITING SAMPLES: A WINDOW INTO THE DEVELOPING WRITER

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INTRODUCTION:

BEGINNING PARAGRAPHS: STUDENTS ARE STARTING TO UNDERSTAND THE IMPORTANCE OF PARAGRAPHING, ALTHOUGH PARAGRAPHING MIGHT NOT ALWAYS BE CONSISTENTLY APPLIED.

NARRATIVE STRUCTURE: NARRATIVES SHOW A DEVELOPING UNDERSTANDING OF PLOT, CHARACTERS, AND SETTING, THOUGH THE PLOT MAY BE SIMPLE AND LINEAR.

DESCRIPTIVE LANGUAGE: STUDENTS ARE BEGINNING TO INCORPORATE DESCRIPTIVE WORDS AND PHRASES, THOUGH THESE MAY BE SOMEWHAT SIMPLISTIC.

INCONSISTENT SPELLING AND PUNCTUATION: ERRORS ARE EXPECTED AND ARE A NORMAL PART OF THE WRITING PROCESS. FOCUS SHOULD BE ON THE OVERALL COMMUNICATION OF IDEAS.

H2: CASE STUDIES: ANALYZING INDIVIDUAL 3RD GRADE WRITING SAMPLES

LET'S EXAMINE TWO CONTRASTING 3RD GRADE WRITING SAMPLES TO ILLUSTRATE THE RANGE OF ABILITIES AT THIS AGE.

CASE STUDY 1: LIAM'S NARRATIVE

HIS SPELLING SHOWS SOME INCONSISTENCIES ("MONKIES" INSTEAD OF "MONKEYS"), BUT HIS OVERALL MESSAGE IS CLEAR AND ENGAGING. THIS EXEMPLIFIES A TYPICAL 3RD GRADE WRITING SAMPLE SHOWCASING A SOLID UNDERSTANDING OF NARRATIVE STRUCTURE AND CLEAR COMMUNICATION. HIS USE OF DESCRIPTIVE WORDS, ALTHOUGH LIMITED, ADDS TO THE VIVIDNESS OF THE NARRATIVE. THIS SAMPLE DEMONSTRATES APPROPRIATE PROGRESS FOR A 3RD GRADER.

CASE STUDY 2: MAYA'S EXPOSITORY PIECE

MAYA'S ESSAY, "WHY I LIKE TO READ," DEMONSTRATES A MORE ADVANCED LEVEL OF WRITING. SHE USES MORE COMPLEX SENTENCES, EMPLOYS TRANSITION WORDS ("FIRST," "NEXT," "FINALLY"), AND ORGANIZES HER IDEAS LOGICALLY INTO PARAGRAPHS. WHILE HER SPELLING IS NOT PERFECT, HER GRAMMATICAL STRUCTURES ARE MORE SOPHISTICATED THAN LIAM'S. THIS 3RD GRADE WRITING SAMPLE SHOWS EXCEPTIONAL WRITING ABILITIES FOR HER AGE AND SUGGESTS A STRONG FOUNDATIONAL UNDERSTANDING OF EXPOSITORY WRITING TECHNIQUES. ANALYZING MAYA'S WRITING REVEALS A CAPACITY FOR MORE COMPLEX THOUGHTS AND EXPRESSION.

H3: USING 3RD GRADE WRITING SAMPLES FOR ASSESSMENT AND INSTRUCTION
