The reason is because cursive writing comes with benefits that are absent in printing. For example, writing in cursive helps improve brain development particularly in thinking and in working memory. It is also responsible in activating both hemispheres of the brain for synapses and synchronicity. Use this workbook for cursive writing practice.
