1. "What are you thinking?"

1. "Why don't you ever...?" (Followed by a complaint)

It implies criticism and a judgment of his character rather than an attempt at understanding. The "why don't you ever..." phrasing tends to focus on perceived failures rather than seeking solutions.

Better Alternative: Express your needs and feelings using "I" statements. For instance, instead of "Why don't you ever help with the chores?", try: "I feel overwhelmed with household tasks lately. Could we discuss how we can better share responsibilities?" This shifts the focus from blame to collaboration and problem-solving.

1. "Are you still mad?"

This question can be perceived as intrusive and dismissive. It puts pressure on him to reveal his emotions, even if he's not comfortable doing so. Assuming he's still angry, even if he isn't, can escalate tension. Including this in the list of 5 questions a woman should never ask a man emphasizes the importance of giving him space and respecting his emotional processing.

Better Alternative: Approach the issue directly and calmly. Rather than focusing on his emotions, focus on the situation. For example, "I'm sorry if I upset you earlier. Can we talk about what happened?" This gives him the opportunity to express himself without feeling pressured.

1. "Why are men like that?"

This broad generalization is deeply unhelpful and disrespectful. It reduces men to a monolithic group, ignoring the individuality and diversity within the male population. This allows for a constructive discussion about a specific incident, rather than perpetuating harmful stereotypes.
