WHO IS AFFECTED BY THE PROBLEM? UNDERSTANDING THE STAKEHOLDERS AND THEIR PERSPECTIVES IS ESSENTIAL FOR DEVELOPING A SOLUTION THAT ADDRESSES EVERYONE'S NEEDS.

WHAT ARE THE MEASURABLE IMPACTS OF THE PROBLEM? QUANTIFYING THE PROBLEM'S EFFECTS HELPS TO PRIORITIZE IT AND MEASURE THE SUCCESS OF YOUR SOLUTION.

WHAT ARE THE CONSTRAINTS? RESOURCE LIMITATIONS, TIME CONSTRAINTS, AND REGULATORY CONSTRAINTS ALL INFLUENCE THE SCOPE AND FEASIBILITY OF SOLUTIONS.
