Musculoskeletal: Joint pain, muscle weakness, etc.

Neurological: Headaches, dizziness, numbness, weakness, etc.

Hematologic: Easy bruising, bleeding, etc.

Endocrine: Changes in weight, thirst, appetite, etc.

Psychiatric: Mood changes, anxiety, depression, etc.

The ROS component within the 7 components of health history helps uncover subtle symptoms and potential problems that might not have been explicitly reported.

The diagnostic process is a complex, collaborative activity that involves clinical reasoning and information gathering to determine a patient's health problem. According to *Improving Diagnosis in Health Care*, diagnostic errors-inaccurate or delayed diagnoses-persist throughout all settings of care and continue to harm an unacceptable number of patients. It is likely that most people will experience at least one diagnostic error in their lifetime, sometimes with devastating consequences. Diagnostic errors may cause harm to patients by preventing or delaying appropriate treatment, providing unnecessary or harmful treatment, or resulting in psychological or financial repercussions. The committee concluded that improving the diagnostic process is not only possible, but also represents a moral, professional, and public health imperative. *Improving Diagnosis in Health Care*, a continuation of the landmark Institute of Medicine reports *To Err Is Human* (2000) and *Crossing the Quality Chasm* (2001), finds that diagnosis-and, in particular, the occurrence of diagnostic errors"has been largely unappreciated in efforts to improve the quality and safety of health care.
