PLAGIARISM AND ACADEMIC DISHONESTY: PRESENTING OTHERS' WORK AS ONE'S OWN, WHETHER KNOWINGLY OR UNKNOWINGLY.

UNETHICAL ASSESSMENT PRACTICES: DESIGNING ASSESSMENTS THAT ARE UNFAIR, BIASED, OR UNRELIABLE, COMPROMISING THE VALIDITY OF STUDENT EVALUATIONS.

PROMOTING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT: PROVIDING EDUCATORS WITH TRAINING ON ETHICAL TEACHING PRACTICES, INFORMATION LITERACY, AND CRITICAL THINKING SKILLS.

STRENGTHENING INSTITUTIONAL POLICIES: DEVELOPING CLEAR POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR ADDRESSING ACADEMIC DISHONESTY AND FALSE TEACHING, ALONGSIDE ROBUST REPORTING MECHANISMS.

FOSTERING OPEN COMMUNICATION: CREATING A CULTURE WHERE STUDENTS FEEL COMFORTABLE REPORTING CONCERNS WITHOUT FEAR OF RETALIATION.

PROMOTING MEDIA LITERACY: EDUCATING STUDENTS ON HOW TO EVALUATE INFORMATION SOURCES CRITICALLY AND IDENTIFY MISINFORMATION.

IMPLEMENTING ROBUST ASSESSMENT METHODS: DESIGNING ASSESSMENTS THAT ACCURATELY REFLECT STUDENT UNDERSTANDING AND DISCOURAGE CHEATING.
