The outside world is brought clamoring into their makeshift family. Set in a region known for its independent spirit, *Stay and Fight* shakes up what it means to be a family, to live well, to make peace with nature and make deals with the system. It is a protest novel that challenges our notions of effective action. It is a family novel that refuses to limit the term. And it is a marvel of storytelling that both breaks with tradition and celebrates it.
