HER SIMPLE ACTS OF KINDNESS, HER UNWAVERING LOVE, AND HER QUIET STRENGTH CONTINUE TO INSPIRE ME. THIS IS THE ESSENCE OF A GUIDE RECOGNIZING YOUR SAINTS: ACKNOWLEDGING THE PROFOUND INFLUENCE OF THESE INDIVIDUALS ON OUR LIVES.
