WOODWINDS: THESE INSTRUMENTS USE AIR TO CREATE THEIR SOUND, AND EACH HAS ITS OWN DISTINCT CHARACTER. FLUTES SOUND BRIGHT AND AIRY, CLARINETS ARE EXPRESSIVE AND VERSATILE, OBOES HAVE A WARM, SLIGHTLY NASAL TONE, AND BASSOONS PROVIDE A DEEPER, RICHER SOUND.

BRASS: THE BRASS SECTION OFFERS POWERFUL AND MAJESTIC SOUNDS, OFTEN HEARD IN HEROIC OR TRIUMPHANT MOMENTS. TRUMPETS, FRENCH HORNS, TROMBONES, AND TUBAS EACH CONTRIBUTE TO THE RICHNESS OF ORCHESTRAL MUSIC. NOTICE HOW THEIR SOUNDS VARY IN BRIGHTNESS AND TONE.

PERCUSSION: THE PERCUSSION SECTION IS THE MOST DIVERSE, WITH A WIDE VARIETY OF INSTRUMENTS CREATING A RHYTHM AND TEXTURE. DRUMS, CYMBALS, XYLOPHONES, TIMPANI (KETTLEDRUMS), AND COUNTLESS OTHER INSTRUMENTS ADD EXCITEMENT AND COLOR TO THE ORCHESTRAL SOUND. PAY ATTENTION TO THE DIFFERENT SOUNDS AND RHYTHMS EACH ONE CREATES.

H2: UNDERSTANDING ORCHESTRAL MUSIC: A YOUNG PERSON'S APPROACH

LISTENING TO AN ORCHESTRA CAN FEEL OVERWHELMING AT FIRST, BUT WITH A LITTLE GUIDANCE, IT BECOMES AN ENRICHING EXPERIENCE.

DYNAMICS: NOTICE HOW THE MUSIC CHANGES IN VOLUME (LOUD AND SOFT – FORTE AND PIANO). THIS IS CALLED DYNAMICS AND IT HELPS TO CREATE EMOTIONAL IMPACT.

TEMPO: OBSERVE HOW THE SPEED OF THE MUSIC CHANGES (FAST AND SLOW – ALLEGRO AND ADAGIO). THIS IS THE TEMPO AND SIGNIFICANTLY AFFECTS THE OVERALL MOOD.

MELODY AND HARMONY: LISTEN FOR THE MAIN TUNE (MELODY) AND HOW OTHER INSTRUMENTS CREATE A SUPPORTING SOUND (HARMONY) SIMULTANEOUSLY. THIS INTERPLAY CREATES THE RICH TAPESTRY OF ORCHESTRAL MUSIC.

STRUCTURE: MANY ORCHESTRAL PIECES HAVE CLEAR SECTIONS. PAY ATTENTION TO THE STRUCTURE – HOW THE MUSIC BUILDS, CHANGES, AND RESOLVES.

H2: ATTENDING AN ORCHESTRA CONCERT: TIPS FOR YOUNG LISTENERS

GOING TO A LIVE CONCERT IS AN AMAZING EXPERIENCE! HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO ENHANCE YOUR ENJOYMENT:

DIFFICULTY CONCENTRATING: TAKE BREAKS IF NEEDED. IT'S OKAY TO NOT FOCUS ON THE ENTIRE PERFORMANCE AT ONCE.

NOT KNOWING WHAT TO EXPECT: DO SOME RESEARCH ABOUT THE COMPOSER AND THE PIECE BEFORE ATTENDING A CONCERT.
