H2: BEYOND THE DISCIPLINES: A HOLISTIC APPROACH TO LEARNING

H3: CASE STUDY 1: THE ENVIRONMENTAL ADVOCATE

ONE OF MY CLASSMATES, SARAH, HAD A BACKGROUND IN ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE BUT LACKED THE COMMUNICATION SKILLS NECESSARY TO EFFECTIVELY ADVOCATE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION. THE AAS IN INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES EQUIPPED HER WITH THE TOOLS SHE NEEDED. THROUGH COURSES ON PERSUASIVE WRITING AND PUBLIC SPEAKING, SHE HONED HER COMMUNICATION ABILITIES, ULTIMATELY LEADING TO HER SECURING A POSITION AS A COMMUNICATIONS SPECIALIST FOR A LEADING ENVIRONMENTAL ORGANIZATION. HER SUCCESS EXEMPLIFIES THE PRACTICAL APPLICABILITY OF AN AAS IN

INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES AND ITS POWER TO BRIDGE THE GAP BETWEEN THEORETICAL KNOWLEDGE AND REAL-WORLD APPLICATION.

HE'S NOW A SUCCESSFUL COMMUNITY ORGANIZER, USING HIS SKILLS TO MOBILIZE HIS COMMUNITY AROUND SOCIAL JUSTICE ISSUES.

H5: FLEXIBILITY AND ADAPTABILITY: THE HALLMARKS OF AN AAS IN INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES
