THESE CREDITS DEMONSTRATE A COMMITMENT TO STAYING CURRENT WITH THE LATEST ADVANCEMENTS IN OPHTHALMIC TECHNOLOGY, RESEARCH, AND BEST PRACTICES. THE SIGNIFICANCE OF ABO CONTINUING EDUCATION CANNOT BE OVERSTATED; IT DIRECTLY IMPACTS PATIENT CARE BY ENSURING OPTOMETRISTS POSSESS THE MOST UP-TO-DATE KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS. HOWEVER, THE COST OF THESE COURSES CAN BE A SIGNIFICANT BARRIER FOR SOME PROFESSIONALS, ESPECIALLY THOSE STARTING THEIR CAREERS OR FACING FINANCIAL CONSTRAINTS. THEREFORE, THE SEARCH FOR "ABO CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS FREE" IS A COMMON ONE.

FINDING FREE OR LOW-COST ABO CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS

WHILE COMPLETELY FREE ABO CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS ARE RELATIVELY RARE, SEVERAL AVENUES CAN SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCE OR EVEN ELIMINATE THE COST. UNDERSTANDING THESE OPTIONS IS CRUCIAL FOR OPTOMETRISTS SEEKING TO FULFILL THEIR CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS WITHOUT INCURRING SUBSTANTIAL EXPENSES.

1. **LEVERAGING PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZATIONS:** MANY PROFESSIONAL OPTOMETRY ORGANIZATIONS, INCLUDING THE AOA, OFFER WEBINARS, ONLINE MODULES, AND EVEN IN-PERSON EVENTS WITH ASSOCIATED ABO CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS AT A REDUCED COST OR OCCASIONALLY FOR FREE. MEMBERSHIP OFTEN UNLOCKS ACCESS TO THESE RESOURCES, MAKING IT A WORTHWHILE INVESTMENT IN THE LONG RUN. ACTIVELY CHECKING THE AOA WEBSITE AND OTHER RELEVANT PROFESSIONAL GROUPS' WEBSITES FOR ANNOUNCEMENTS ABOUT FREE OR SUBSIDIZED CONTINUING EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES IS ESSENTIAL. THE KEY IS TO BE PROACTIVE AND REMAIN INFORMED. REMEMBER TO ALWAYS VERIFY THAT THE COURSES INDEED OFFER ABO-APPROVED CREDITS BEFORE ENROLLING.
1. **EXPLORING FREE ONLINE RESOURCES:** SEVERAL REPUTABLE ONLINE PLATFORMS PROVIDE FREE EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS RELATED TO OPTOMETRY. WHILE THESE MIGHT NOT ALWAYS DIRECTLY GRANT ABO CREDITS, THEY CAN ENHANCE YOUR KNOWLEDGE AND POTENTIALLY PROVIDE THE FOUNDATIONAL UNDERSTANDING NEEDED FOR PAID COURSES. THESE RESOURCES MIGHT INCLUDE OPEN-ACCESS JOURNALS, ONLINE LECTURES FROM UNIVERSITIES, AND EDUCATIONAL

PODCASTS. WHILE THEY WON'T SUBSTITUTE FOR ACCREDITED COURSES, THEY CAN SUPPLEMENT YOUR LEARNING AND MAKE PAID COURSES MORE MANAGEABLE. ALWAYS DOUBLE-CHECK THE EDUCATIONAL VALUE AND WHETHER THE INFORMATION IS UP-TO-DATE AND ALIGNED WITH CURRENT BEST PRACTICES.

1. PARTICIPATING IN RESEARCH STUDIES: SOME RESEARCH STUDIES IN THE OPHTHALMIC FIELD OFFER CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS AS COMPENSATION FOR PARTICIPATION. THIS IS A UNIQUE WAY TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE ADVANCEMENT OF THE PROFESSION WHILE SIMULTANEOUSLY FULFILLING CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS. LOOK FOR RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES ADVERTISED THROUGH PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZATIONS, UNIVERSITIES, AND HOSPITALS. THIS PATH MAY REQUIRE MORE TIME COMMITMENT BUT OFFERS SIGNIFICANT COST SAVINGS.

1. TAKING ADVANTAGE OF INSTITUTIONAL RESOURCES: IF YOU ARE EMPLOYED BY A HOSPITAL, CLINIC, OR LARGE OPTOMETRY PRACTICE, INQUIRE ABOUT POTENTIAL INTERNAL TRAINING PROGRAMS OR EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES. MANY INSTITUTIONS OFFER OPPORTUNITIES FOR EMPLOYEES TO ENHANCE THEIR SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE, SOMETIMES INCLUDING THE ACQUISITION OF ABO CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS AT NO COST OR AT A REDUCED PRICE. THIS IS A VALUABLE PERK TO EXPLORE WHEN EMPLOYED BY A LARGER ORGANIZATION.

1. SEEKING GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS: SOME ORGANIZATIONS OFFER GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS SPECIFICALLY DESIGNED TO SUPPORT THE CONTINUING EDUCATION OF OPTOMETRISTS. WHILE COMPETITION FOR THESE RESOURCES MAY BE FIERCE, IT'S WORTHWHILE TO EXPLORE ALL POSSIBILITIES AND SUBMIT APPLICATIONS. THESE OPPORTUNITIES MAY BE OFFERED THROUGH PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZATIONS, FOUNDATIONS, AND EVEN INDIVIDUAL OPTOMETRIC SCHOOLS.

1. NEGOTIATING WITH EMPLOYERS: DISCUSS THE POSSIBILITY OF YOUR EMPLOYER COVERING THE COST OF YOUR CONTINUING EDUCATION. MANY EMPLOYERS RECOGNIZE THE VALUE OF A WELL-TRAINED WORKFORCE AND ARE WILLING TO INVEST IN THEIR EMPLOYEES' PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT. FRAME YOUR REQUEST AS AN INVESTMENT IN IMPROVED PATIENT CARE AND IMPROVED OVERALL PRACTICE PERFORMANCE.

1. UTILIZING FREE WEBINARS AND ONLINE COURSES: MANY COMPANIES AND INSTITUTIONS OFFER FREE WEBINARS AND ONLINE COURSES THAT CAN CONTRIBUTE TO YOUR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT, EVEN IF THEY DON'T DIRECTLY OFFER ABO CREDITS. THE KNOWLEDGE GAINED CAN STILL ENHANCE YOUR SKILLS AND KEEP YOU UP-TO-DATE WITH THE LATEST ADVANCEMENTS IN THE FIELD. ALWAYS VERIFY IF THE OFFERED CONTENT ALIGNS WITH CURRENT BEST PRACTICES AND THE LATEST RESEARCH.

Black Lives Matter and #MeToo show that racism and sexism remain pervasive on campus, while student and faculty movements fight to reverse increased tuition, student debt, corporatization, and adjunctification. Commentators typically frame these issues as crises for an otherwise optimal mode of intellectual and professional development. In *Beyond Education*, Eli Meyerhoff instead sees this impasse as inherent to universities, as sites of intersecting political struggles over resources for studying. Meyerhoff argues that the predominant mode of study, education, is only one among many alternatives and that it must be deromanticized in order to recognize it as a colonial-capitalist institution. He traces how key elements of education—the vertical trajectory of individualized development, its role in preparing people to participate in governance through a pedagogical mode of accounting, and dichotomous figures of educational waste (the “dropout”) and value (the “graduate”)—emerged from histories of struggles in opposition to alternative modes of study bound up with different modes of world-making. Through interviews with participants in contemporary university struggles and embedded research with an anarchist free university, *Beyond Education* paves new avenues for achieving the aims of an “alter-university” movement to put novel modes of study into practice. Taking inspiration from Black Lives Matter, Occupy Wall Street, and Indigenous resurgence projects, it charts a new course for movements within, against, and beyond the university as we know it.

 REDD+ must be transformational. REDD+ requires broad institutional and governance reforms, such as tenure, decentralisation, and corruption control. These reforms will enable departures from business as usual, and involve communities and forest users in making and implementing policies that affect them. Policies must go beyond forestry. REDD+ strategies must include policies outside the forestry sector narrowly defined, such as agriculture and energy, and better coordinate across sectors to deal with non-forest drivers of deforestation and degradation. Performance-based payments are key, yet limited. Payments based on performance directly incentivise and compensate forest owners and users. But schemes such as payments for environmental services (PES) depend on conditions, such as secure tenure, solid carbon data and transparent governance, that are often lacking and take time to change. This constraint reinforces the need for broad institutional and policy reforms. We must learn from the past. Many approaches to REDD+ now being considered are similar to previous efforts to conserve and better manage forests, often with limited success. Taking on board lessons learned from past experience will improve the prospects of REDD+ effectiveness. National circumstances and uncertainty must be factored in. Different country contexts will create a variety of REDD+ models with different institutional and policy mixes. Uncertainties about the shape of the future global REDD+ system, national readiness and political consensus require flexibility and a phased approach to REDD+ implementation.

Entrepreneurship has attracted global interest for its potential to catalyze economic and social development. Research suggesting that certain entrepreneurial mindsets and skills can be learned has given rise to the field of entrepreneurship education and training (EET). Despite the growth of EET, global knowledge about these programs and their impact remains thin. In response, this study surveys the available literature and program evaluations to propose a Conceptual Framework for understanding the EET program landscape. The study finds that EET today consists of a heterogeneous mix of programs that can be broken into two groups: entrepreneurship education and entrepreneurship training. These programs target a range of participants: secondary and post-secondary education students, as well as potential and practicing entrepreneurs. The outcomes measured by program evaluations are equally diverse but generally fall under the domains of entrepreneurial mindsets and capabilities, entrepreneurial status, and entrepreneurial performance. The dimensions of EET programs vary according the particular target group. Programs targeting secondary education students focus on the development of foundational skills linked to entrepreneurship, while post-secondary education programs emphasize skills related to strategic business planning. Programs targeting potential entrepreneurs generally are embedded within broader support programs and tend to target vulnerable populations for whom employment alternatives may be limited. While programs serving practicing entrepreneurs focus on strengthening entrepreneurs knowledge, skills and business practices, which while unlikely to transform an enterprise in the near term, may accrue benefits to entrepreneurs over time. The study also offers implications for policy and program implementation, emphasizing the importance of clarity about target groups and desired outcomes when making program choices, and sound understanding of extent to which publicly-supported programs offer a broader public good, and compare favorably to policy alternatives for supporting the targeted individuals as well as the overall economic and social objectives.
