This case solidified my belief in the power and necessity of the ACC/AHA perioperative cardiac risk assessment.

Case Study 1: The High-Risk Patient

A 78-year-old woman with a history of unstable angina, severe aortic stenosis, and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease was scheduled for a hip replacement. Her ACC/AHA perioperative cardiac risk assessment placed her in a very high-risk category. A multidisciplinary team, including cardiologists, anesthesiologists, and surgeons, was assembled to devise a comprehensive plan. This involved meticulous pre-operative cardiac optimization, including coronary angiography, and a careful selection of anesthetic techniques to minimize cardiac stress. Their findings agree with the 2006 Surgeon General's Report conclusion that there are increased risks of coronary heart disease morbidity and mortality among men and women exposed to secondhand smoke. However, the authors note that the evidence for determining the magnitude of the relationship between chronic secondhand smoke exposure and coronary heart disease is not very strong. Public health professionals will rely upon *Secondhand Smoke Exposure and Cardiovascular Effects* for its survey of critical epidemiological studies on the effects of smoking bans and evidence of links between secondhand smoke exposure and cardiovascular events, as well as its findings and recommendations.
