ANALYSIS FOCUSES ON IDENTIFYING EMERGENT THEMES AND PATTERNS WITHIN THE CREATED CATEGORIES.

2.2 CLOSED CARD SORTING: CLOSED CARD SORTING PROVIDES PARTICIPANTS WITH A PREDEFINED SET OF CATEGORIES. THEY ARE THEN TASKED WITH ASSIGNING EACH CARD TO ONE OF THESE EXISTING CATEGORIES. THIS APPROACH IS USEFUL WHEN YOU HAVE A PRE-EXISTING INFORMATION ARCHITECTURE OR WANT TO TEST THE EFFECTIVENESS OF A PROPOSED STRUCTURE. THE ACTIVITY CARD SORT ASSESSMENT DATA COLLECTED HERE PROVIDES INSIGHTS INTO THE CLARITY AND USABILITY OF THE PRE-DEFINED CATEGORIES.

2.3 HYBRID CARD SORTING: THIS APPROACH COMBINES ELEMENTS OF BOTH OPEN AND CLOSED CARD SORTING. FOR EXAMPLE, PARTICIPANTS MIGHT BE PROVIDED WITH SOME PRE-DEFINED CATEGORIES, BUT ALSO ALLOWED TO CREATE NEW ONES IF NEEDED.
