creatinine levels decreased, urine output increased, and his other electrolyte imbalances resolved. He was successfully weaned off hemodialysis after a week. At discharge, he was advised to follow up with a nephrologist for ongoing monitoring of renal function. This acute kidney injury case study highlights the importance of early recognition and aggressive management of AKI.
