CLEAR AND CONCISE WRITING: THE MANUSCRIPT SHOULD BE WRITTEN IN CLEAR, CONCISE, AND GRAMMATICALLY CORRECT ENGLISH, ADHERING TO THE JOURNAL'S STYLE GUIDE.

ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS: ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS, INCLUDING INFORMED CONSENT, CONFIDENTIALITY, AND POTENTIAL RISKS AND BENEFITS TO PARTICIPANTS, MUST BE CAREFULLY ADDRESSED. ADHERENCE TO RELEVANT ETHICAL GUIDELINES IS

POORLY WRITTEN MANUSCRIPT: A POORLY WRITTEN MANUSCRIPT, CHARACTERIZED BY GRAMMATICAL ERRORS, UNCLEAR WRITING, OR INAPPROPRIATE TONE, WILL LIKELY BE REJECTED.

IGNORING ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS: FAILURE TO ADDRESS ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS APPROPRIATELY WILL LEAD TO IMMEDIATE REJECTION.
