There's Alex, the ACLU lawyer with a heart of gold if you're a criminal but darkest mistrust of the rest of us... politically correct wife Allison, juggling her PC jargon as adeptly as a performer at Ringling Brothers... Devon, the brooding uber-feminist, a bundle of neuroses wrapped up in basic black... Sierra, the 48-year-old hippie who boarded the New Age bandwagon in the '60s and never got off... and little Jayson, the hapless 6-year-old: will he adopt the galloping insanity of the Lane household, or follow sister Diversity's path to normalcy?
