PROPOSED SOLUTION (HIGH-LEVEL): OUTLINING THE PROPOSED SOLUTION IN GENERAL TERMS, ACKNOWLEDGING THAT DETAILS WILL EVOLVE THROUGHOUT THE PROJECT LIFECYCLE.

AGILE APPROACH JUSTIFICATION: EXPLAINING WHY AN AGILE APPROACH IS BEST SUITED TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEM, EMPHASIZING ITS FLEXIBILITY AND RESPONSIVENESS.

VALUE PROPOSITION: ARTICULATING THE EXPECTED BUSINESS BENEFITS, FOCUSING ON MEASURABLE OUTCOMES AND QUANTIFIABLE ROI (RETURN ON INVESTMENT) WHERE POSSIBLE.

SUCCESS METRICS & KPIs: DEFINING CLEAR AND MEASURABLE KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS (KPIs) THAT WILL BE USED TO

TRACK PROGRESS AND MEASURE SUCCESS.

ITERATION PLAN & BUDGET: PRESENTING A HIGH-LEVEL ITERATION PLAN WITH ASSOCIATED BUDGET ESTIMATES, UNDERSTANDING THAT THESE WILL BE REFINED OVER TIME.

RISK ASSESSMENT & MITIGATION: IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL RISKS AND OUTLINING MITIGATION STRATEGIES.

TEAM & RESOURCES: DETAILING THE TEAM COMPOSITION AND NECESSARY RESOURCES.

STAKEHOLDER ANALYSIS: IDENTIFYING KEY STAKEHOLDERS AND THEIR EXPECTATIONS.

UNLIKE TRADITIONAL BUSINESS CASES, THE AGILE BUSINESS CASE TEMPLATE EMPHASIZES FLEXIBILITY AND CONTINUOUS ADAPTATION. IT'S A LIVING DOCUMENT, UPDATED AND REFINED THROUGHOUT THE PROJECT'S LIFECYCLE TO REFLECT EVOLVING PRIORITIES AND LEARNINGS.

3. CHALLENGES IN IMPLEMENTING AN AGILE BUSINESS CASE TEMPLATE

DESPITE THE CLEAR BENEFITS, ORGANIZATIONS OFTEN ENCOUNTER CHALLENGES WHEN IMPLEMENTING AN AGILE BUSINESS CASE TEMPLATE:
