CUSTOMER COLLABORATION OVER CONTRACT NEGOTIATION: ENGAGING STAKEHOLDERS CONTINUOUSLY THROUGHOUT THE PROJECT.

RESPONDING TO CHANGE OVER FOLLOWING A PLAN: EMBRACING FLEXIBILITY AND ADAPTING TO EVOLVING REQUIREMENTS.

THESE PRINCIPLES ARE TRANSLATED INTO VARIOUS AGILE FRAMEWORKS, INCLUDING SCRUM, KANBAN, AND LEAN, EACH WITH ITS OWN SPECIFIC APPROACH TO AGILE LIFE CYCLE MANAGEMENT. HOWEVER, ALL SHARE A COMMON THREAD: ITERATIVE DEVELOPMENT, WHERE PROJECTS ARE BROKEN DOWN INTO SMALLER, MANAGEABLE CYCLES (SPRINTS OR ITERATIONS), ENABLING CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT AND RISK MITIGATION.

3. AGILE FRAMEWORKS AND THEIR APPLICATION IN AGILE LIFE CYCLE MANAGEMENT

SCRUM: A POPULAR FRAMEWORK CHARACTERIZED BY SHORT SPRINTS (TYPICALLY 2-4 WEEKS), DAILY STAND-UP MEETINGS, SPRINT REVIEWS, AND RETROSPECTIVES. SCRUM EXCELS IN MANAGING COMPLEX PROJECTS WHERE REQUIREMENTS MAY EVOLVE OVER TIME.

KANBAN: EMPHASIZES VISUALIZING WORKFLOW, LIMITING WORK IN PROGRESS (WIP), AND CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT THROUGH IDENTIFYING BOTTLENECKS. KANBAN IS WELL-SUITED FOR PROJECTS WITH CONTINUOUS DELIVERY AND EVOLVING PRIORITIES.

LEAN: FOCUSES ON ELIMINATING WASTE AND MAXIMIZING VALUE. LEAN PRINCIPLES ARE OFTEN INTEGRATED INTO OTHER AGILE FRAMEWORKS TO IMPROVE EFFICIENCY AND EFFECTIVENESS.

THE CHOICE OF FRAMEWORK DEPENDS ON THE SPECIFIC PROJECT CONTEXT, TEAM SIZE, AND ORGANIZATIONAL CULTURE. MANY ORGANIZATIONS ADOPT A HYBRID APPROACH, COMBINING ELEMENTS OF DIFFERENT FRAMEWORKS TO CREATE A CUSTOMIZED AGILE LIFE CYCLE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.
