Scrum is the most widely used Agile framework. This “Agile Project Management for Dummies” section explains it using a simple analogy. Imagine a rugby scrum—a tightly knit team working together to achieve a common goal. In Scrum, this goal is broken down into short sprints (typically 2-4 weeks). Each sprint results in a working increment of the project. Key roles include:

PRODUCT OWNER: DEFINES THE PRODUCT VISION AND PRIORITIZES FEATURES.
SCRUM MASTER: FACILITATES THE SCRUM PROCESS AND REMOVES IMPEDIMENTS.
DEVELOPMENT TEAM: BUILDS THE PRODUCT.
