CASE STUDY 1: IMPROVING PATIENT MATCHING WITH AHIMA'S DATA QUALITY MANAGEMENT MODEL

WE SAW A 75% REDUCTION IN DUPLICATE RECORDS WITHIN SIX MONTHS, LEADING TO IMPROVED PATIENT SAFETY AND SUBSTANTIAL COST SAVINGS.

CASE STUDY 2: ENHANCING DATA INTEGRITY IN A CLINICAL RESEARCH SETTING USING AHIMA'S DATA QUALITY MANAGEMENT MODEL

ONE PARTICULARLY MEMORABLE EXPERIENCE INVOLVED WORKING WITH A SMALL, RURAL CLINIC STRUGGLING WITH OUTDATED DATA MANAGEMENT PRACTICES. BY INTRODUCING THEM TO THE BASIC PRINCIPLES OF AHIMA'S DATA QUALITY MANAGEMENT MODEL, FOCUSING ON SIMPLE IMPROVEMENTS LIKE STANDARDIZED DATA ENTRY FORMS AND REGULAR DATA AUDITS, WE ACHIEVED A NOTICEABLE IMPROVEMENT IN THEIR DATA ACCURACY AND EFFICIENCY. A KEY COMPONENT OF AHIMA'S DATA QUALITY MANAGEMENT MODEL IS THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A ROBUST DATA GOVERNANCE FRAMEWORK.
