THE AKC THERAPY DOG TEST ITSELF ASSESSES A DOG'S ABILITY TO HANDLE DISTRACTIONS, REMAIN CALM AND COMPOSED IN UNFAMILIAR ENVIRONMENTS, AND INTERACT APPROPRIATELY WITH DIVERSE INDIVIDUALS, INCLUDING CHILDREN, THE ELDERLY, AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES.
