DEADLINES: BE AWARE OF REGISTRATION DEADLINES, WHICH VARY DEPENDING ON THE ELECTION. ALWAYS CHECK THE ALAMEDA COUNTY REGISTRAR OF VOTERS WEBSITE FOR THE MOST UP-TO-DATE INFORMATION.
