HOWEVER, THE INFORMATION AVAILABLE THROUGH THESE SOURCES IS OFTEN INCOMPLETE AND MAY NOT REFLECT THE FULL PICTURE OF AN INDIVIDUAL'S CRIMINAL HISTORY. FAIRNESS AND NON-DISCRIMINATION: CRIMINAL HISTORY INFORMATION SHOULD BE USED RESPONSIBLY AND NOT LEAD TO DISCRIMINATORY PRACTICES. EMPLOYERS AND LANDLORDS SHOULD CONSIDER THE CONTEXT AND RELEVANCE OF PAST CRIMINAL ACTIVITY WHEN MAKING DECISIONS.

DATA SECURITY: ROBUST DATA SECURITY MEASURES ARE CRUCIAL TO PROTECT THE CONFIDENTIALITY OF SENSITIVE CRIMINAL HISTORY INFORMATION.
