The analysis highlights the importance of rigorous methodology and evidence-based conclusions in historical linguistics.

5. Conclusion

The claim of the "albanian language 6000 years old" remains highly controversial and lacks robust scientific support. While the desire to trace Albanian's origins to a distant past is understandable, the evidence presented often falls short of meeting the stringent standards required for such a significant claim. Future research should focus on strengthening the methodological foundations for studying the deep history of Albanian, incorporating multiple lines of evidence while maintaining a critical and unbiased approach. The current lack of conclusive evidence suggests that a more conservative estimate of Albanian's age is far more scientifically justifiable.
