THIS INSIGHT PROVED REMARKABLY PRESIDENT, PARTICULARLY CONSIDERING THE RAPID INDUSTRIALIZATION AND GLOBALIZATION THAT OCCURRED IN THE LATE 19TH AND EARLY 20TH CENTURIES.
