INTRODUCTION: UNDERSTANDING THE RISE OF ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS

ALICE TRAINING, WHICH STANDS FOR ALERT, LOCKDOWN, INFORM, COUNTER, EVACUATE, HAS BECOME A PROMINENT ACTIVE SHOOTER RESPONSE STRATEGY IN MANY SCHOOLS ACROSS THE UNITED STATES. THIS DETAILED ANALYSIS EXPLORES THE HISTORICAL CONTEXT SURROUNDING ITS ADOPTION, ITS CURRENT RELEVANCE IN THE FACE OF EVOLVING SCHOOL SAFETY CONCERNS, AND ITS ONGOING DEBATE WITHIN THE EDUCATIONAL COMMUNITY. HOWEVER, FOLLOWING SEVERAL HIGH-PROFILE SCHOOL SHOOTINGS, CRITICS ARGUED THAT THIS APPROACH WAS INSUFFICIENT AND COULD LEAVE STUDENTS AND STAFF VULNERABLE FOR EXTENDED PERIODS. ALICE TRAINING EMERGED AS AN ALTERNATIVE, ADVOCATING FOR A MORE PROACTIVE AND DYNAMIC RESPONSE. ITS DEVELOPMENT WAS INFLUENCED BY LAW ENFORCEMENT TACTICS AND A SHIFT TOWARDS PREPARING INDIVIDUALS TO POTENTIALLY ENGAGE WITH AN ACTIVE SHOOTER, RATHER THAN SIMPLY HIDING PASSIVELY. THE RISE OF ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS COINCIDED WITH A GROWING AWARENESS OF THE LIMITATIONS OF TRADITIONAL LOCKDOWN PROCEDURES AND A DESIRE FOR MORE EFFECTIVE STRATEGIES.

THE CORE COMPONENTS OF ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS

ALICE TRAINING EMPHASIZES EMPOWERING INDIVIDUALS TO MAKE INFORMED DECISIONS IN THE FACE OF AN ACTIVE THREAT. ITS CORE COMPONENTS INCLUDE:

ALERT: RECOGNIZING THE SIGNS OF A POTENTIAL THREAT AND IMMEDIATELY NOTIFYING AUTHORITIES.

LOCKDOWN: SECURING CLASSROOMS OR DESIGNATED SAFE SPACES, BUT ONLY AS A LAST RESORT IF EVACUATION IS IMPOSSIBLE.

INFORM: PROVIDING CONTINUOUS UPDATES TO STUDENTS AND STAFF ABOUT THE SITUATION, AS WELL AS COMMUNICATING WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT.

COUNTER: TAKING PROACTIVE MEASURES TO DISRUPT OR DETER THE ATTACKER, IF POSSIBLE AND SAFE TO DO SO. THIS MAY INVOLVE THROWING OBJECTS OR CREATING DIVERSIONS.

EVACUATE: ESCAPING THE IMMEDIATE DANGER ZONE IF A SAFE ESCAPE ROUTE IS AVAILABLE.

THE EMPHASIS ON "COUNTER" AS A COMPONENT OF ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS HAS BEEN A MAJOR SOURCE OF DEBATE, WITH CONCERNS REGARDING THE POTENTIAL RISKS AND THE SUITABILITY OF SUCH TACTICS FOR UNTRAINED CIVILIANS.

CURRENT RELEVANCE AND ONGOING DEBATE SURROUNDING ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS

THE CONTINUED RELEVANCE OF ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS IS TIED TO THE PERSISTENT THREAT OF SCHOOL SHOOTINGS AND THE NEED FOR COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY PLANS. HOWEVER, THE PROGRAM IS NOT WITHOUT ITS CRITICS. CONCERNS HAVE BEEN RAISED ABOUT:

THE POTENTIAL FOR ESCALATING VIOLENCE: SOME ARGUE THAT ENCOURAGING CONFRONTATION COULD UNINTENTIONALLY INCREASE THE RISK OF HARM TO STUDENTS AND STAFF.

THE LACK OF EMPIRICAL EVIDENCE SUPPORTING ITS EFFECTIVENESS: WHILE ALICE PROponents CITE ANECDOTAL EVIDENCE, RIGOROUS STUDIES EVALUATING THE PROGRAM'S IMPACT ARE LIMITED.

THE TRAINING'S COMPLEXITY AND POTENTIAL FOR CONFUSION: THE MULTI-FACETED NATURE OF ALICE MAY OVERWHELM STUDENTS AND STAFF, LEADING TO INCONSISTENT OR INEFFECTIVE RESPONSES.

THE PSYCHOLOGICAL IMPACT ON STUDENTS: THE POTENTIAL FOR LONG-TERM TRAUMA ASSOCIATED WITH PARTICIPATING IN SUCH INTENSE TRAINING SIMULATIONS.

ALTERNATIVES TO ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS

SEVERAL ALTERNATIVE APPROACHES TO SCHOOL SAFETY EXIST, INCLUDING ENHANCED SECURITY MEASURES (METAL DETECTORS, SECURITY PERSONNEL), IMPROVED MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS AND STAFF, AND STRICTER GUN CONTROL LEGISLATION. THESE APPROACHES ARE OFTEN SEEN AS COMPLEMENTARY TO, RATHER THAN REPLACEMENTS FOR, ACTIVE SHOOTER RESPONSE TRAINING. THE CHOICE OF A SPECIFIC TRAINING PROGRAM, INCLUDING ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS, SHOULD BE INFORMED BY A COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL SAFETY PLAN THAT ADDRESSES MULTIPLE LAYERS OF RISK MITIGATION.

CONCLUSION: A BALANCED PERSPECTIVE ON ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS

ALICE TRAINING HAS UNDOUBTEDLY PLAYED A SIGNIFICANT ROLE IN SHAPING SCHOOL SAFETY STRATEGIES IN THE 21ST CENTURY. ITS EMPHASIS ON PROACTIVE RESPONSES AND EMPOWERING INDIVIDUALS REFLECTS A SHIFT AWAY FROM PURELY PASSIVE LOCKDOWN PROCEDURES. HOWEVER, CONCERNS REGARDING ITS POTENTIAL RISKS AND THE LACK OF CONCLUSIVE EVIDENCE REGARDING ITS EFFECTIVENESS DEMAND CAREFUL CONSIDERATION. A BALANCED APPROACH INVOLVES A THOROUGH ASSESSMENT OF THE PROGRAM'S SUITABILITY WITHIN THE SPECIFIC CONTEXT OF EACH SCHOOL, COUPLED WITH A MULTIFACETED STRATEGY THAT ENCOMPASSES ENHANCED SECURITY MEASURES, MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT, AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT. THE ONGOING DEBATE SURROUNDING ALICE TRAINING IN SCHOOLS HIGHLIGHTS THE NEED FOR CONTINUOUS EVALUATION, RESEARCH, AND OPEN DIALOGUE TO ENSURE THE SAFETY AND WELL-BEING OF STUDENTS AND STAFF.

This report notes that while the United States invests more in K-12 public education than many other developed countries, its students are ill prepared to compete with their global peers. According to the results of the 2009 Program for International Student Assessment (PISA), an international assessment that measures the performance of 15-year-olds in reading, mathematics, and science every three years, U.S. students rank fourteenth in reading, twenty-fifth in math, and seventeenth in science compared to students in other industrialized countries. The lack of preparedness poses threats on five national security fronts: economic growth and competitiveness, physical safety, intellectual property, U.S. global awareness, and U.S. unity and cohesion, says the report. Too many young people are not employable in an increasingly high-skilled and global economy, and too many are not qualified to join the military because they are physically unfit, have criminal records, or have an inadequate level of education. The report proposes three overarching policy recommendations: implement educational expectations and assessments in subjects vital to protecting national security; make structural changes to provide students with good choices; and, launch a national security readiness audit to hold schools and policymakers accountable for results and to raise public awareness.

In India's rural Andhra Pradesh, for instance, only about one in twenty children in fifth grade can perform basic arithmetic. The problem is that schooling is not the same as learning. Pritchett argues that many developing countries superficially imitate systems that were successful in other nations—much as a nonpoisonous snake mimics the look of a poisonous one. Pritchett argues that the solution is to allow functional systems to evolve locally out of an environment pressured for success. Such an ecosystem needs to be open to variety and experimentation, locally operated, and flexibly financed. The only main cost is ceding control; the reward would be the rebirth of education suited for today's world.
