1ST GRADE READINESS ASSESSMENT: A COMPREHENSIVE ANALYSIS

TESTS LIKE THE METROPOLITAN READINESS TEST (MRT) GAINED POPULARITY, AIMING TO QUANTIFY A CHILD'S PREPAREDNESS FOR FORMAL SCHOOLING. THESE EARLY ASSESSMENTS LARGELY CONCENTRATED ON COGNITIVE ABILITIES, NEGLECTING CRUCIAL ASPECTS OF SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT.

THE LATTER HALF OF THE 20TH CENTURY SAW A GROWING RECOGNITION OF THE LIMITATIONS OF SOLELY FOCUSING ON ACADEMIC SKILLS. RESEARCH INCREASINGLY HIGHLIGHTED THE IMPORTANCE OF SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL) IN A CHILD'S OVERALL SCHOOL SUCCESS. THIS SHIFT LED TO THE INCORPORATION OF SEL COMPONENTS INTO MANY 1ST GRADE READINESS ASSESSMENTS. THE CURRENT LANDSCAPE REFLECTS THIS EVOLUTION, WITH A GREATER EMPHASIS ON COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENTS THAT EVALUATE BOTH COGNITIVE AND NON-COGNITIVE FACTORS.
